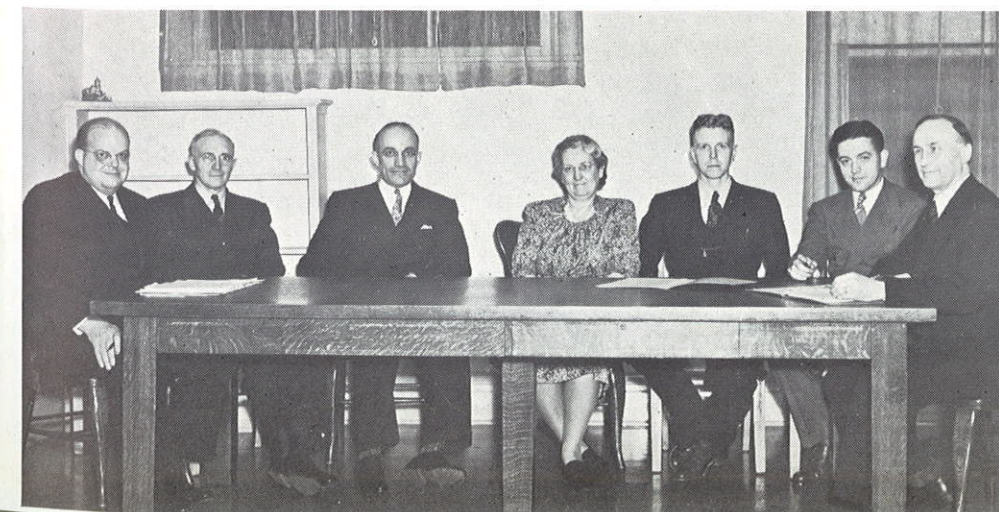
Office Staff

The senior class has most decidedly been a credit to itself; to its advisers; and to the school as a whole.

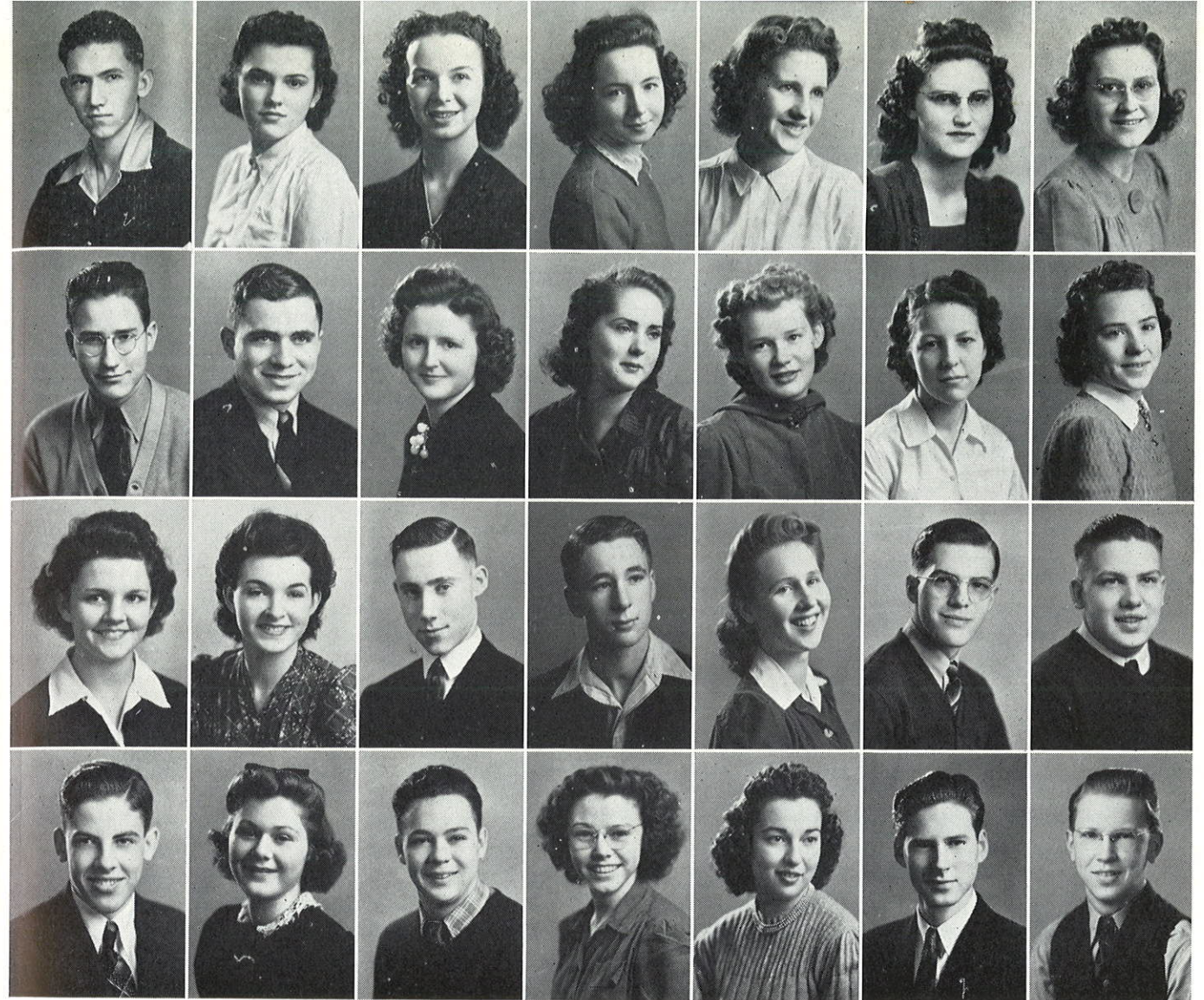

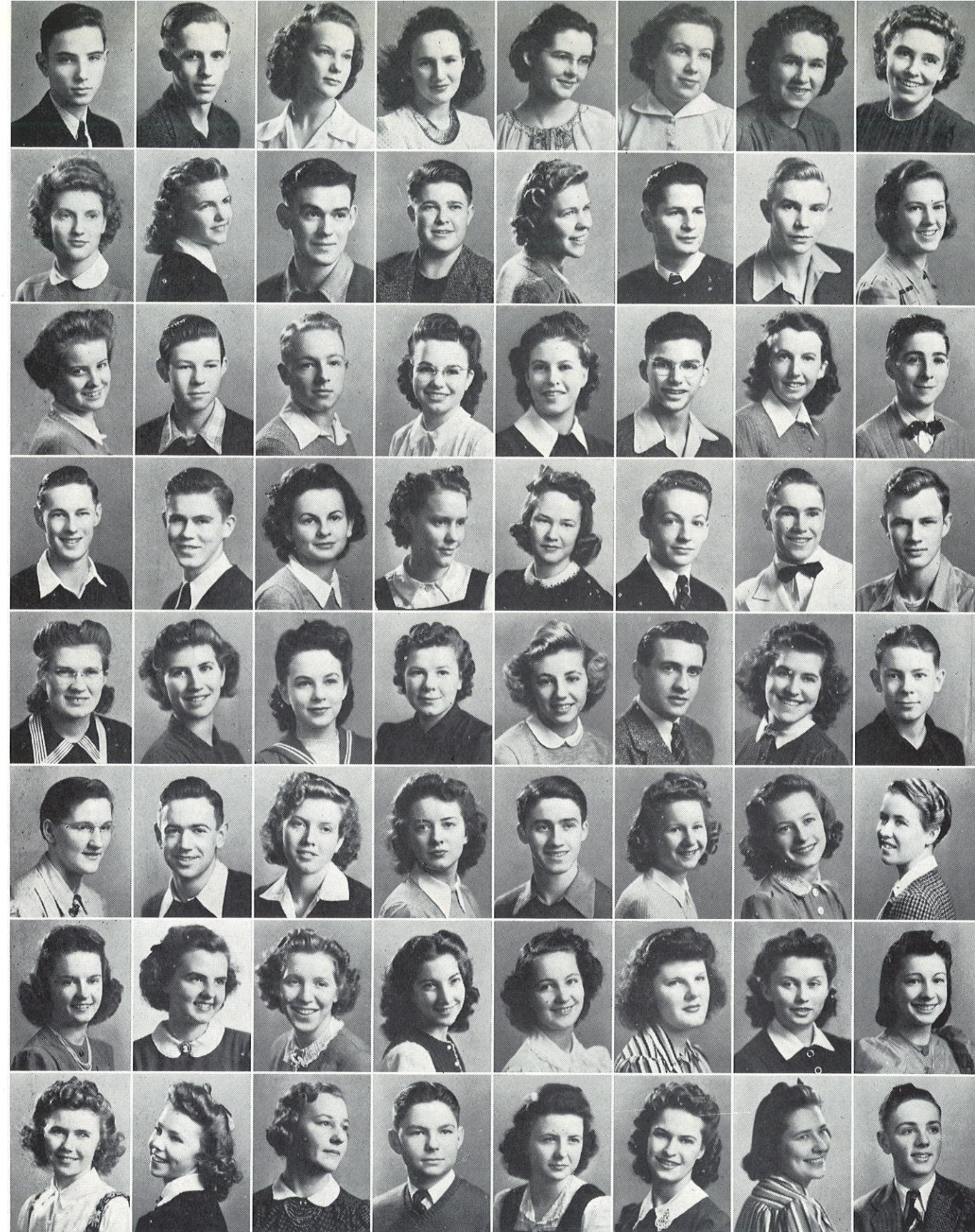
Junior Class

Forensics

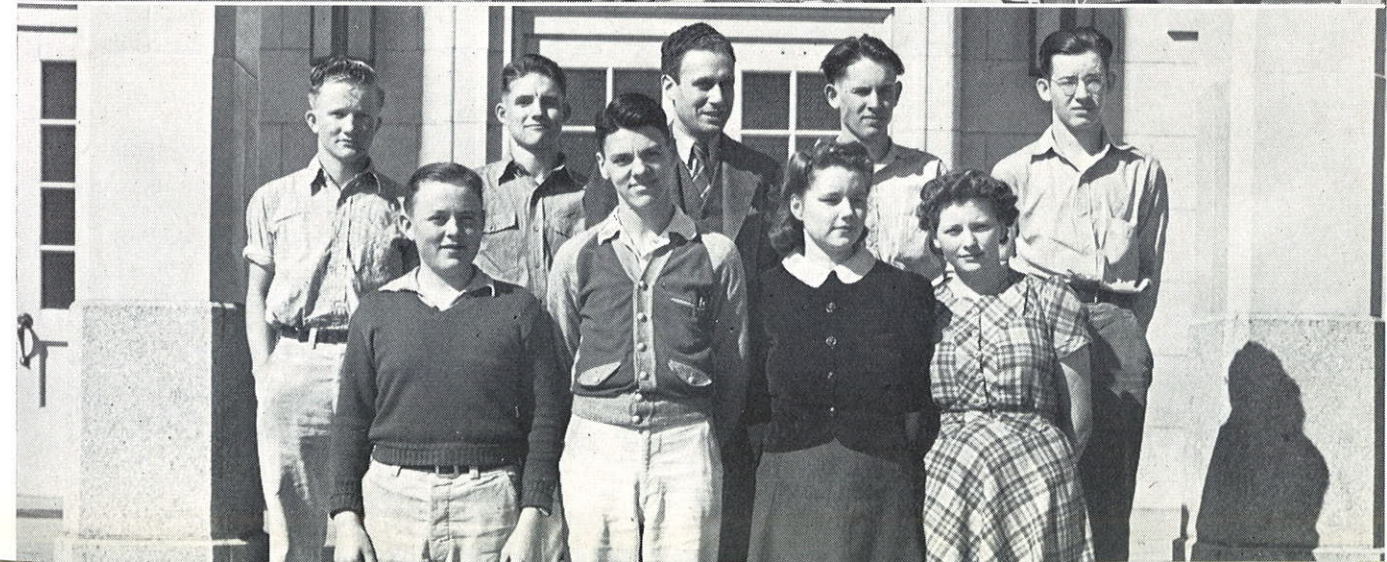

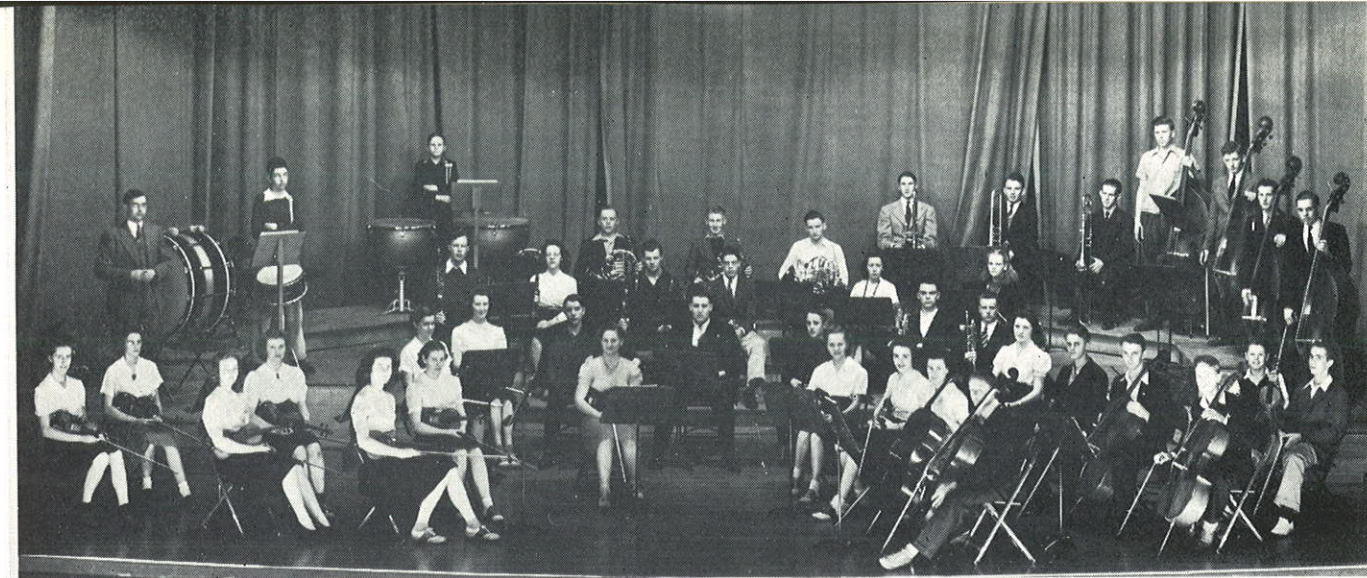


Band

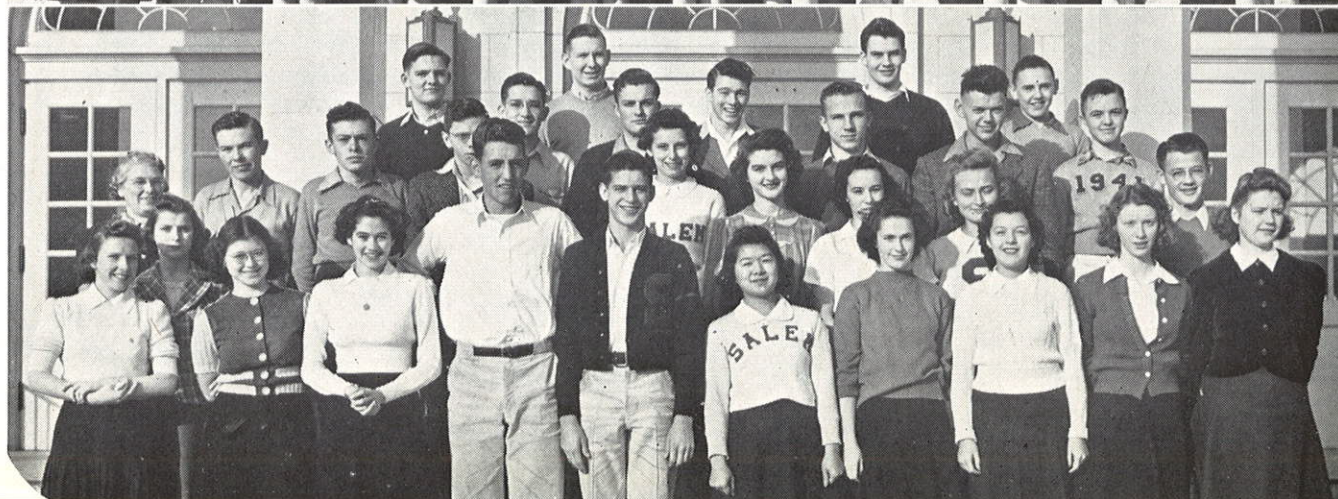
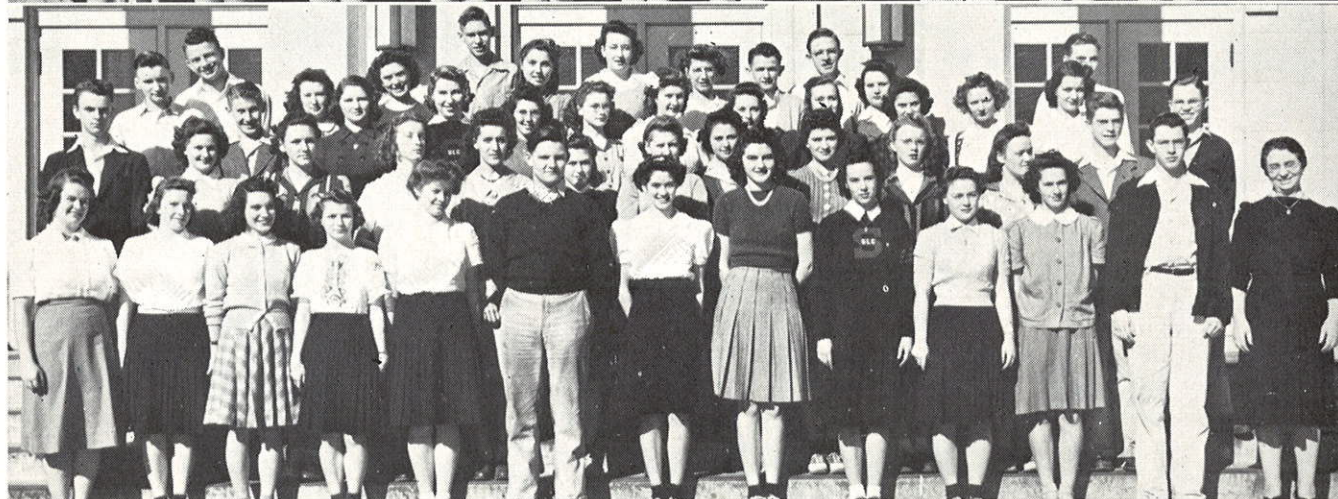
Girls' League

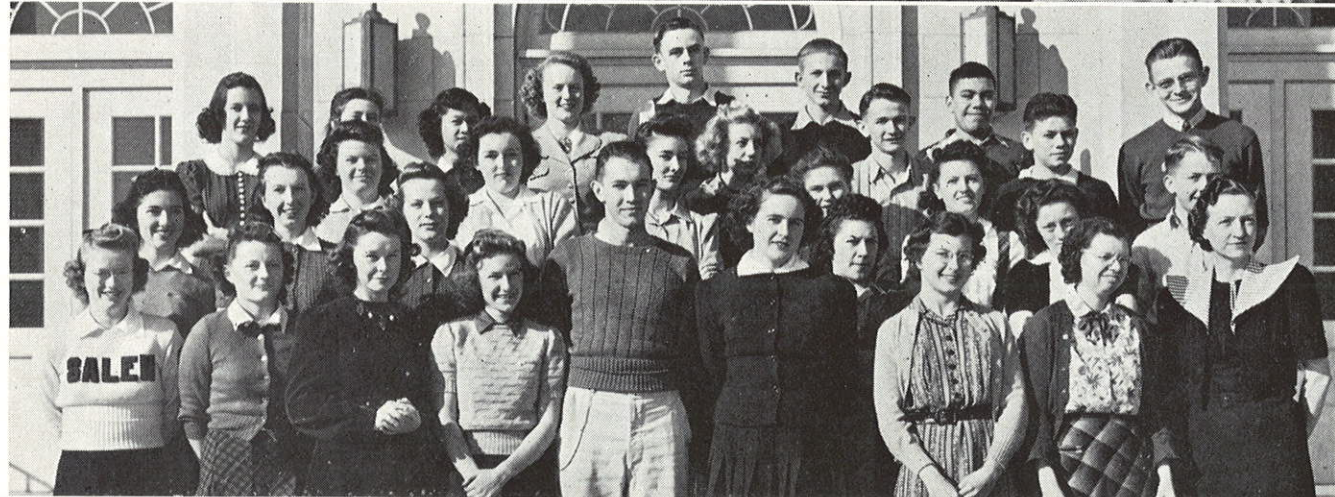

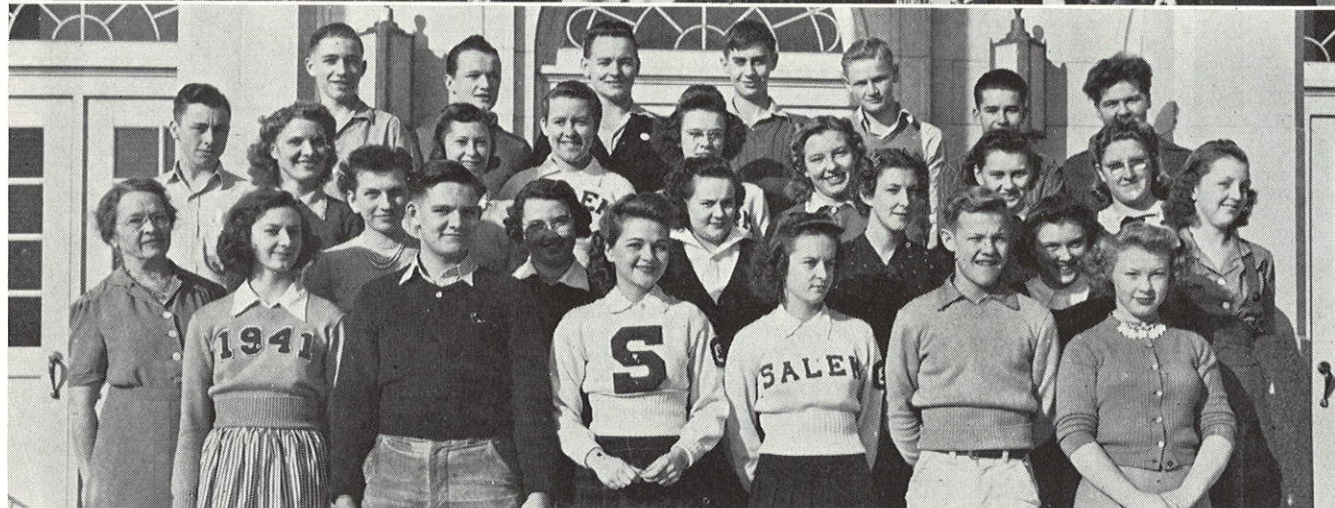


French Club

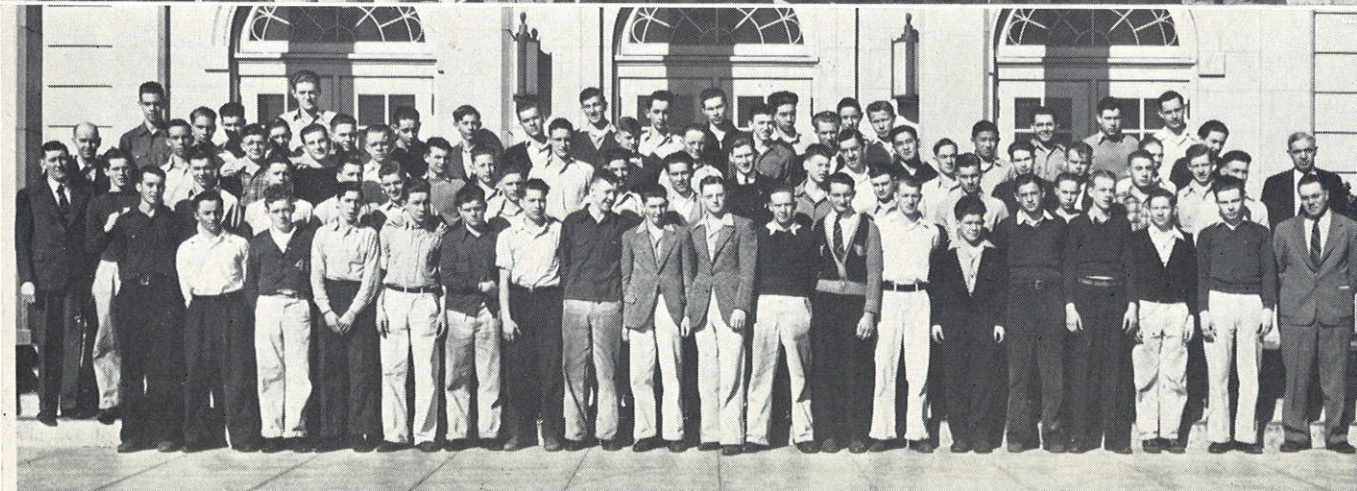


Home Economics Club

At a sectional parliamentary procedure contest, the club placed third.

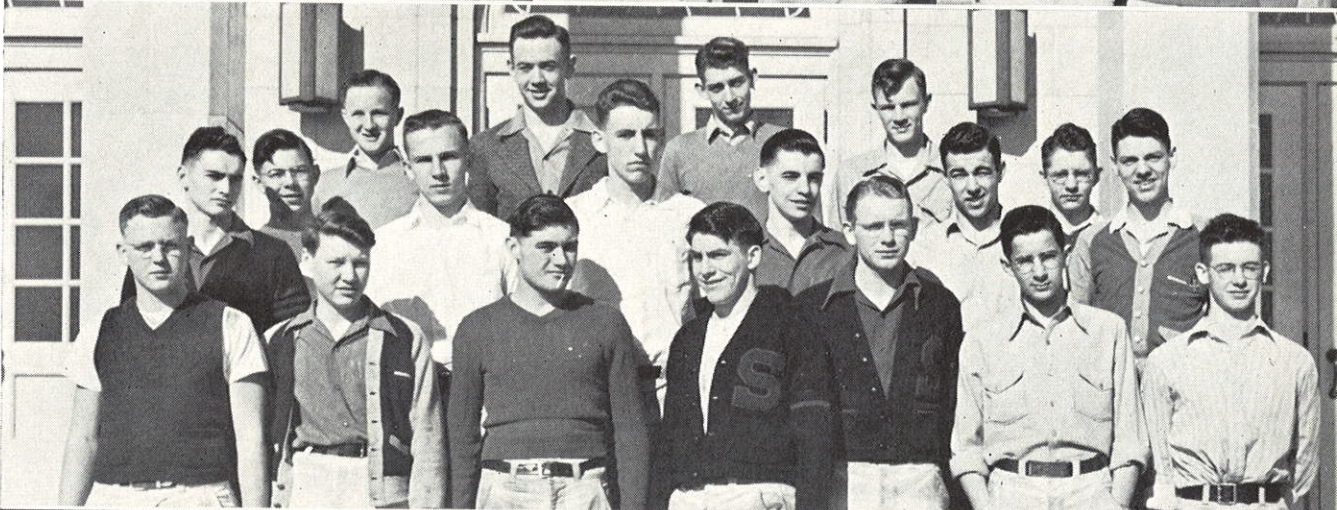
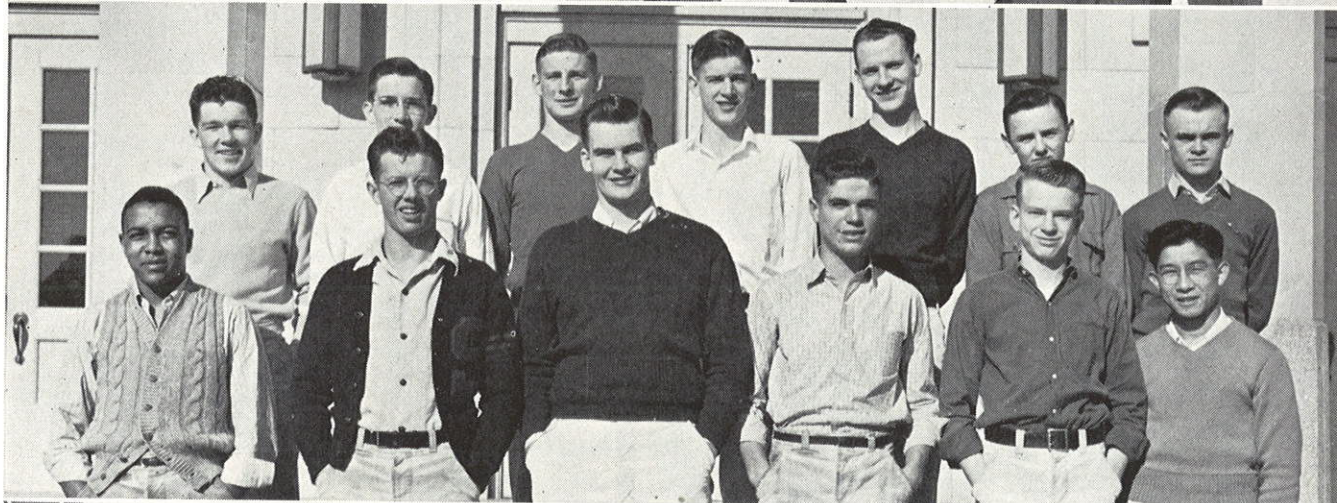
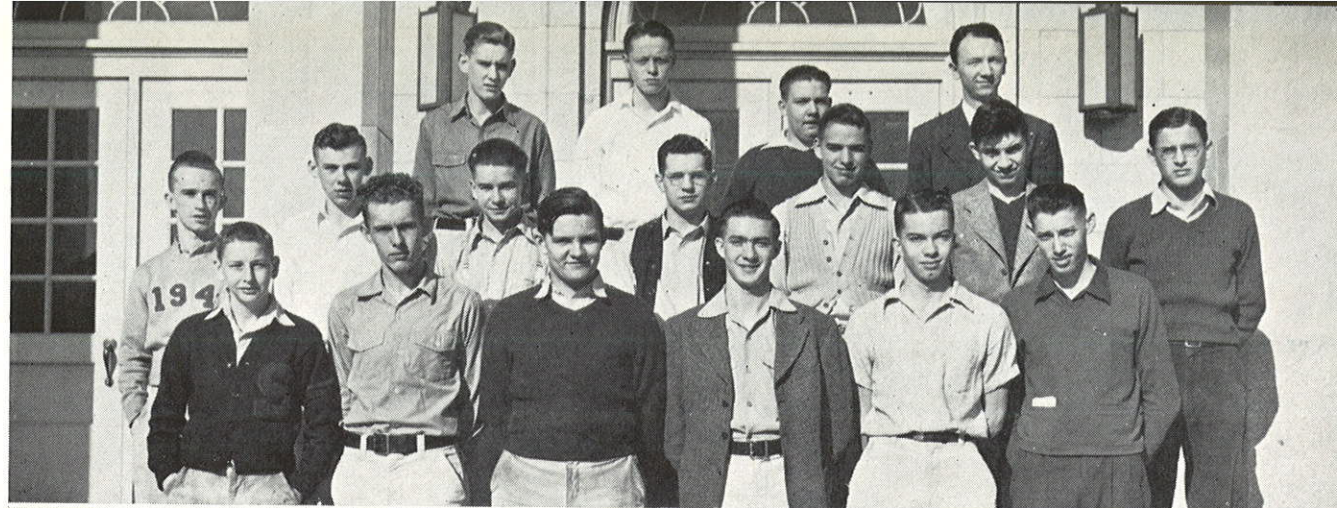

Outstanding activities of the past year were the Tin Can Dance and the Junior Red Cross Rummage sale.

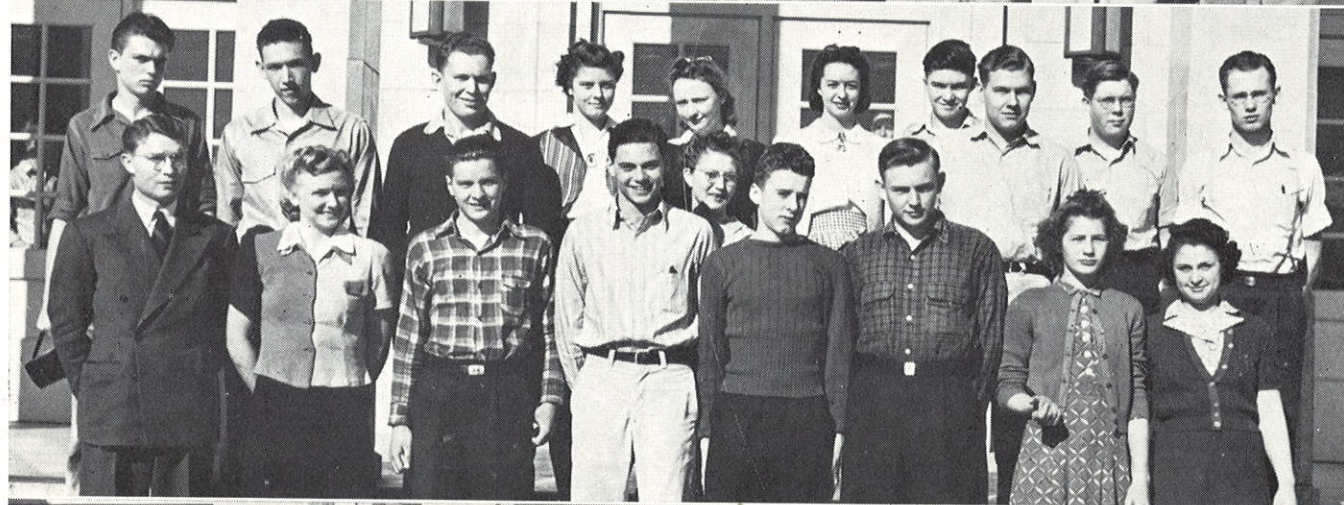

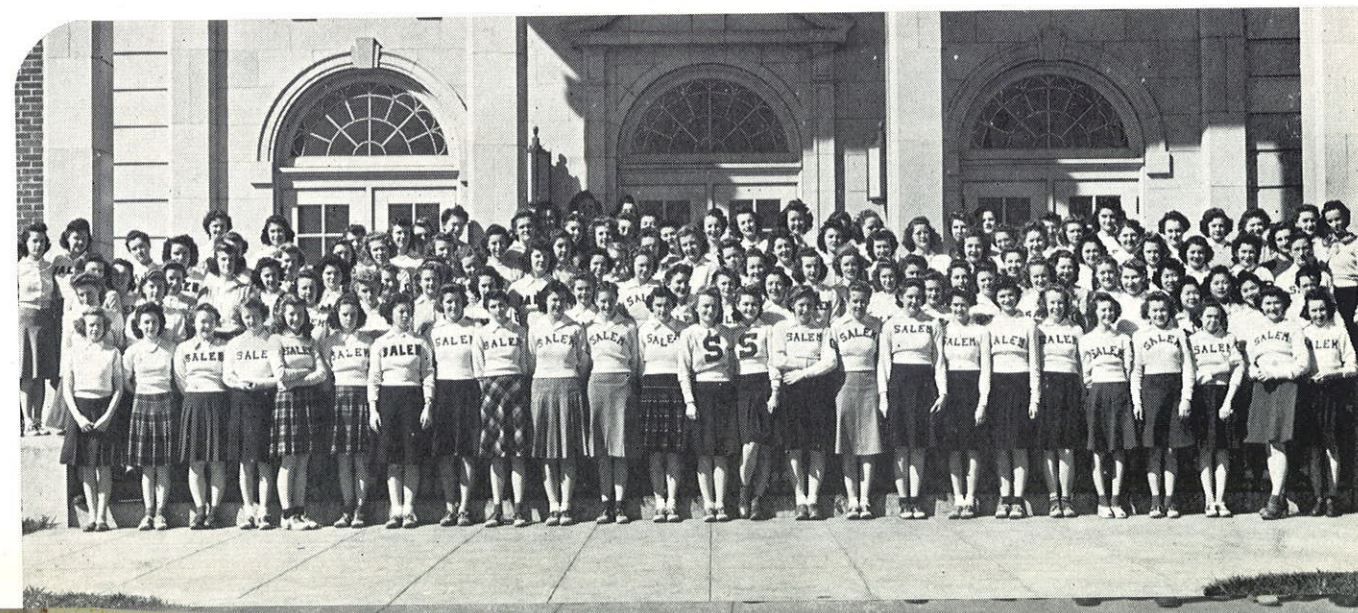
Song and Yell Leaders and Pep Club

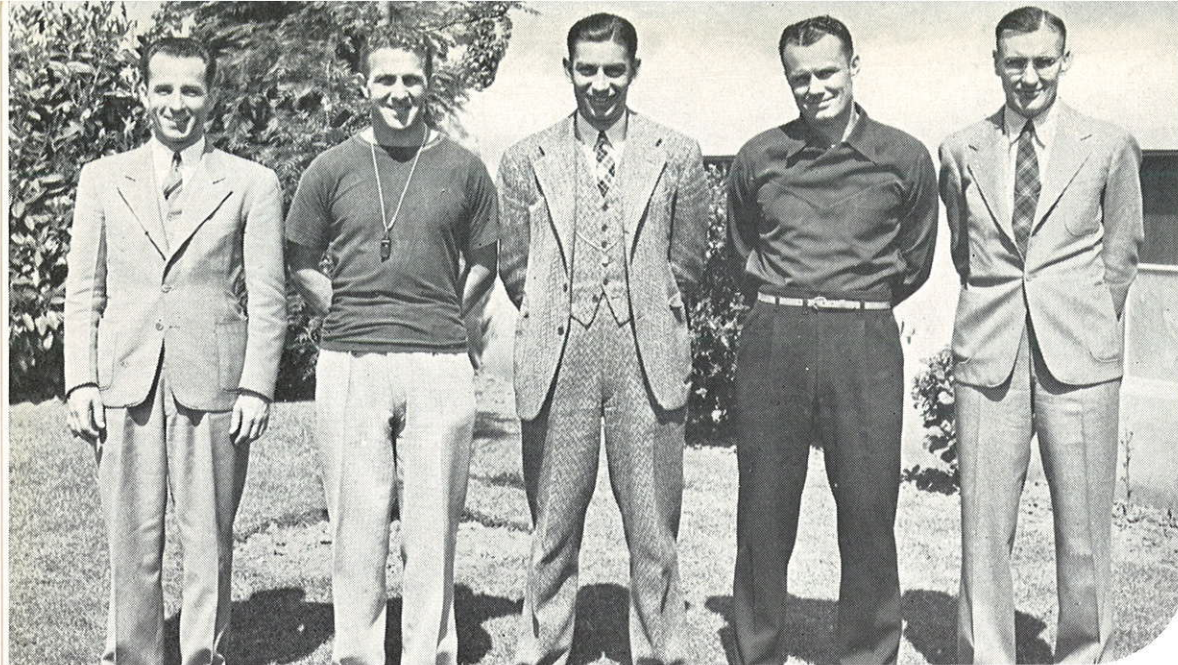

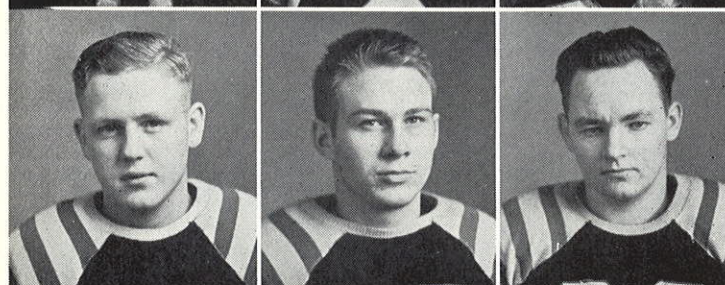
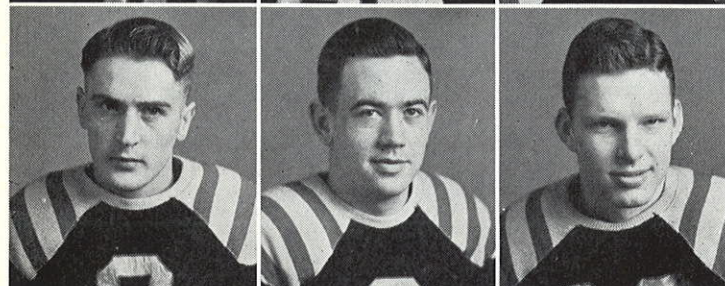
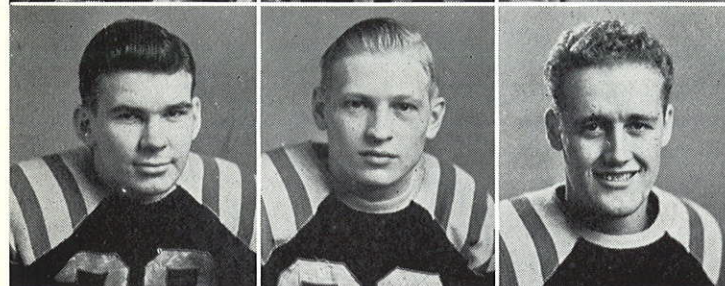
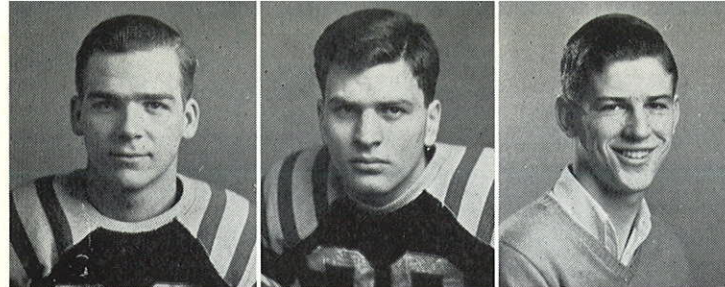
The "S" club again upheld its position as one of the most important and influential clubs in the school. The group, made up entirely of lettermen, has always stood for sportsmanship and school-spirit.

FOOT BALL

Salem High's eleven ceased their 1940 grid wars by battling the state championship Bend outfit to a 7-7 tie.

The Vikings under Coach Harold Hauk turned in an impressive season against the strongest teams in the state. The speedy Salem backfield operating behind a powerful line enabled the Vikings to score decisive wins over Tillamook 19-0, Oregon City 39-7, and Chemawa 40-0, in early season games.

A pleasing 34-0 win over Milwaukie, erasing the stigma of the 33-0 loss of the preceding year, followed by a 33-14 victory in a wild scoring game with Corvallis, came in quick order.

Visions of an undefeated season were crushed when Astoria's mighty fishermen displayed a powerful ground offensive and emerged victorious 14-12.

The annual tussel with Eugene produced the usual hard fought contest. A powerful line smashing offense netting a touch-down and a conversion enabled Salem to eke out a 7-6 win.

No-Name league competition was ended when Salem fought a strong Albany eleven to a 0-0 deadlock, which brought with it a Co-Championship of the No-Name league.



Basketball

The 1941 Salem hoopmen ranked as the surprise quintet of the state. Starting the season with only two returning lettermen, the Vikings completed a highly successful season. The team, under the direction of Coach Harold Hauk, won 19 out of 25 regular season games, lost only one game in grabbing the No-Name league title, and finished in runner-up position in the state tournament.

Using Bud Coons and Eddie Salstrom, returning lettermen, as a nucleus of the team, Coach Hauk completed his quintet by drawing Bob Irish, Don Bower, and "Dutch" Simmons up from last year's Jayvee squad. Reserves seeing the most action were Don Cutler, Warren Ling, and Joe Bowersox.

The Hauk-men marked themselves an outstanding quintet by smothering Corvallis 42-12 in their opening game. Prominent games that followed were the 66-19 scoring spree against Albany; the floor burning contest with Tillamook in which Salem emerged victorious, 45-41; and the two game series with Medford, Medford winning the first, 37-44, and Salem taking the second, 50-39. Journeying to Astoria, the Vikings split two games with the strong Fishermen, losing the first 33-43 and winning the second 31-24. In a return series here, Salem captured both games by scores of 40-32 and 53-19.

Other highlights of the season were the games with the Oregon State Rooks and the Oregon Frosh. The Vikings had the honor of being the only high school team to defeat the Frosh this year, doing this by a score of 39-34. The Frosh won the other game 49-64, while the Rooks took both contests, 29-23 and 21-18.

A single defeat at the hands of the tough Tillamook Cheesemakers was the only loss suffered by Salem in winning the No-Name league championship.

Aiming for a third straight basketball championship, the Vikings entered the state tournament along with Astoria and Klamath Falls as favorites to win the first place trophy. By spilling Columbia Preps 41-32, hurdling McMinnville 46-33, and dropping Klamath Falls 37-26, the Vikings won the right to meet Astoria in the finals. An inspired Astoria team came from behind in the last quarter to knot the score at 32 all at the final whistle and to score three points in the overtime and capture first place by a 35-32 score. Individual honors were won by Eddie Salstrom, who made the first all-state team, and Bud Coons, who made the second all-state team.



Jayvee Basketball

Coach Tommy Drynan's Jayvee squad finished a commendable season with a record of ten wins out of fifteen starts. The ball hawking, hard driving, close checking style of play employed by the Jayvees proved very effective through the season.

No-Name league Jayvee teams, small Willamette Valley high school teams, and city church teams provided competition for the "Baby" Vikings.

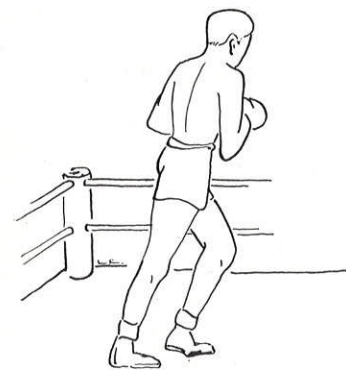


Wrestling

The Salem grunt and groan artists again proved to be tops in the state. By placing three champions—Lyle Dierks, Ray Wilson, and Norman Sholseth—the Vikings won a second consecutive state championship.

Prior to the state meet, Salem emerged victorious in seven out of twelve matches and cinched the district title by winning nine out of twelve weights.

As only one champion, Ray Wilson, had returned from last year's team, little had been expected of the grapplers. Expert guidance from Coach Vern Gilmore, however, plus help from former wrestlers, aided the Vikings in becoming the top team of the state.



Boxing

Since they had the handicap of an incomplete schedule and no regular coach, little was expected of the Viking boxers this year.

After losing the only regular season matches to Lebanon 8-4 and 8-6, the Viking punchers improved rapidly, cinched the district title by defeating Chemawa, and sent seven men to the state tournament. There they won the Vikings' first state championship in boxing. Champions were Jack Knedler, 105, a repeater from last year; Bob Sullivan, 145, a champion in 1939 and 1940; and Bob Boardman, 175.

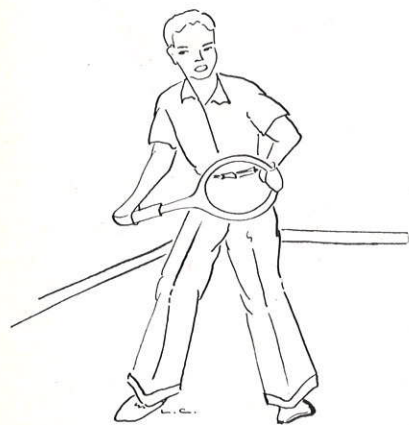


Swimming
