






























# Fall Play: A Colorful Event

The play was directed by Pamela Baldwin with technical direction by Mark Goff. Paul Jones was assistant to the director and Jonna Neff was stage manager.


It was a very colorful production and was enjoyed by those who attended.



Just as important however according to coach Dave Ackerman was the vast improvement in entheusiasm and spirit.








#### J.V. Team Runs Into Hard Luck

### Volleyball Has Winning Season


The varsity volleyball team opened the season with three straight losses and then came back to finish fifth in the competitive Valley League.

Terri Hardman was also elected by her teammates as the most valuable player. Marilyn Johnson was most inspirational, and Melanie Rienstra was voted most improved.


Since the team was so young, most members can return next year with added experience and hope for a winning season.




















#### JV SPIKE SEASON




### An Encouraging Season For Volleyball

#### Vikings Have Superior Season






The team was very young, starting two juniors and a freshman, which will give the Vikings an experienced team for next year and a good prospect for a winning season.


The season was highlighted by a one-point victory over South Albany with Todd Evans putting in a rebound basket at the final buzzer.






In the State Tournament, North finished 8th, the highest of any Valley League School. Bringing in the points for this finish were senior Marvin Seal and junior Mike Ritchey.



During the latter half of the season things changed dramatically. The team improved individually and the refore produced better games and more impressive statistics.






#### Sophomore Boys Improve

#### Young Leads Viking Swimmers


January 21 was a good day indeed for the swimmers of North High. On that Thursday the South Albany team fell to the Viking women.
















### Viks Turn Punky and Preppy




The entire mob of Viking fans ran onto the court yelling and screaming in celebration of the victory for their team. Evans was lifted above the awesome crowd and carried around the court.




### No Hitter Ends Season


### Win Caps J.V. Season























# Varsity girls end season with good spirits




### "Through The Years"

The council meets every Wednesday morning at 7:15 to discuss up coming activities, headed by ASB President David Gerlach, and Activity Advisor Stan Kerzel.




### Germans Keep Interest

This year's French Club took a trip to a fine French cuisine called Chez Moustache, located in Aurora, Oregon.


The club was also very active. They sold candied French Gumi Bears and Toblerones, which are French chocolate bars.




### Club Stages Drama

To go out for Rally, one must have a 2.5 GPA, be passing all classes, and have good attendance.


Prior to Rally try-outs, the candidates must successfully complete the screening process. This screening includes Teacher Evaluation, a Personal Interview and Performance screening.

Last Summer the Varsity Rally went to summer camps and won a collection of superior ribbons and trophies.






Our Viketts worked hard on fund raisers during the summer and during the year to pay for their uniforms, and other expenses that go with Viketts.

Throughout all of these competitions the Viketts had to compete in a dance division rather than drill, where they normally perform.



This summer they are looking forward to being represented at the National Leadership Competition to be held in July at Indianapolis, Indiana.







# Foreign Lands Send Vikings


### Annual Staff Survives


The tough chore of assembling a book such as this becomes really difficult at deadline time, but teamwork and cooperation prevailed and all difficulties were overcome.




### Students dedicated to music

Boosters support all activities, sports and the performing and non-performing arts according to their needs.



For the first time, the Booster Board presented two \$250 scholarships. Scholarships were awarded on the baises of grade point average and the students involvement in North High.



These people put in a lot of time and effort to make our school function. Even though some of these people are rarely seen by students, their efforts are appreciated and we are proud to recognize them here.





An old saying is that "A picture is worth a thousand words." Well, whether it is a picture, pottery, or graphic art, students enjoy producing works of art through North's art department.


With a full, well-educated staff, under the direction of Phyllis Briscoe, the teachers do and outstanding job instructing students in different art fields.


### English Department Blossoms

Increasing the individual student's writing ability level was the goal of the Language Arts Department for the 1981-1982 school year according to Department Chairperson Gary Ritchie.

"Problems reguarding the convenience of the computer, location of students, scheduling of testing, and overall student attitude toward the testing were overcome as the Language Arts staff through their perseverance, cooperation and total man hours spent, helped identify and prepare students to achieve desired writing levels," Ritchie explained.

"Accomplishments of the department included an increasement in the number of offered advanced placement classes and an increasement in course enrollment. Four sections of advanced Freshmen composition and one section of advanced Sophmore composition were added to the curriculum. Also, several previously offered electives were deleted and other more beneficial courses such as public speaking and journalism were added." Ritchie further stated, "that almost 100 percent of the student body was enrolled in at least one Language Arts course and of that 33 percent were taking additional English classes.













### Business Dept. Is In Business



### A Different Way Of Teaching



Well, it is because of the Home Economics program.






### Shop Classes Spark Careers






### Social Studies Changes Faces



Mike Gilson was the third new teacher in the department. Gilson, a former North student, returned to his Alma Mater at the semester break to teach History and Citizenship.


















# Seniors Romp in Powder-Puff

The 1981-82 annual Powder-Puff football game was held on Wednesday, October 14.


